Thank you for your interest in the MBTA Youth Pass Program. In order to participate in the program you must agree to the terms and conditions below. Please review this information and, if you agree to the terms, sign your name below.

**The Youth Pass Program**

The Youth Pass Program is an MBTA Reduced Fare Program administered by the MBTA and participating cities or their non-profit designees.

**The Youth Pass Program allows participants to purchase one MBTA unlimited ride pass for local bus and subway at the reduced fare price of \$30 a month during the time period they are enrolled in the Program.**

To be eligible for the Youth Pass Program, you must submit an application and additional documents as required. These will be used to determine your eligibility (age requirements and additional requirements for applicants between ages 19 and 25) to participate. Submitting an application does not guarantee participation in the program.

By submitting this application and signing this release you are agreeing that you are eligible for the Youth Pass Program under the guidelines determined by the MBTA, including

**Terms of Use**

Participants may not allow anyone else to use their Youth Pass CharlieCard. The MBTA may inspect Youth Pass CharlieCards at any time. Lost cards must immediately be reported to the city office where you obtained your card.

An unauthorized person using a Youth Pass CharlieCard may be subject to criminal/civil penalties under Chapter 161, Section 113A of the MA General Laws and/or any other applicable MA General Laws. Additionally, Participants may be disqualified or suspended from participating in the Youth Pass Program for allowing unauthorized use of their cards.

**Collection, Use, and Deletion of Participant Information**

The MBTA may use Participants' personally identifiable information to investigate possible fraud or misuse of the Youth Pass.

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## MBTA Youth Pass Eligibility Criteria

*Updated June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019*

There are two age groups eligible for the Youth Pass Program:

- A) The first group is individuals who will be 18 or under as of October 31, 2019
- B) The second group are individuals who will be ages 19 to 25 as of October 31, 2019

A) For participants aged 12-18 years old, the following criteria need to be met:

- **\*Not\*** be enrolled in middle or high school (these students may receive a Student CharlieCard through their school – contact your school for more information)
- Live in a participating city or town
- Will be 18 or under as of October 31, 2019. Demonstrate age using any of the following documents
  - Copy of birth certificate
  - Photo ID (Massachusetts ID, Passport, School ID) with date of birth
  - School record or other state record that includes date of birth
  - Visa, residency, or other immigration document with date of birth
  - Notarized Affidavit by legal guardian or parent with date of birth

B) For participants aged 19-25 years old, the following criteria need to be met:

- **\*Not\*** be enrolled in middle or high school (these students may receive a Student CharlieCard through their school – contact your school for more information)
- Live in a participating city or town
- Will be age 19 to 25 on October 31, 2019. Age shall be verified using any of the following documents:
  - Copy of birth certificate
  - Photo ID (Massachusetts ID, Passport, School ID) with date of birth
  - School record or other state record that includes date of birth
  - Visa, residency, or other immigration document with date of birth
- Demonstrate enrollment in at least **one** of the following types of programs. The list of approved programs is outlined below.
  - State/Federal Benefit Programs
  - Alternative Education Programs
  - Job Training Programs

To demonstrate eligibility, an applicant must show an official document from the program that includes their name or name of their parent/guardian, the program name, and the date of their enrollment in the program or expiration date. If no document exists, the participant can return a verification form signed by an administrator at the program and including their contact information for verification purposes.

Each partner city will set their own documentation necessary to verify proof of address.
