The Park and Recreation Commission Design Review Committee has held five public meetings to discuss, solicit input, and review concept plans for the renovation of Robinson Playground. Input from the public and a neighborhood survey has led over a dozen design iterations to accommodate the neighborhood's needs and desires. Safety, accessibility, inclusion, and multi-generational appeal are guiding principles of the design. We invite you to drop-in to share your ideas and input (socially distanced and with masks on) between 10:00 am – Noon at the park on Saturday, September 19, 2020 and to participate in the virtual Design Review Committee Zoom meeting on Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

All park renovation concepts include:

- Universal access into and throughout the park;
- An accessible perimeter loop pathway within the park;
- Inclusive playground redesign including resilient safety surfacing and water play;
- New swing zone for all ages which includes a variety of different swing types;
- Site furniture and destinations for seating and picnicking throughout the park;
- New pergola for use as an outdoor performance and gathering space;
- New plantings to provide the next generation of large shade trees;
- Shared hardcourt play space to accommodate basketball, skateboarding, 4-square & pickleball;
- Renovation of the natural turf areas and amenities within the baseball field
